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# + The Holy Communion +

God promises Jeremiah that a "new covenant" will be made in the future: a covenant that will allow all the people to know God by heart. The church sees this promise fulfilled in Christ, who draws all people to himself when he is lifted up on the cross. Our baptismal covenant draws us to God's heart through Christ and draws God's light and truth into our hearts. We see God's heart most clearly in the way Jesus shares human suffering, in an agony the Hebrews reading describes.

The color for the Sundays in Lent is purple, which represents royalty or penitence.

Blessed be the holy Trinity,  $\pm$  one God, who writes the law on our hearts, who draws all people together through Jesus. **Amen.** 


Held in God's mercy, let us confess our sin in the presence of God and of one another. Silence is kept for reflection.

FIRST READING, a reading from Jeremiah.

(Jeremiah 31:31-34)

The days are surely coming, says the Lord, when I will make a new covenant with the house of Israel and the house of Judah. It will not be like the covenant that I made with their ancestors when I took them by the hand to bring them out of the land of Egypt—a covenant that they broke, though I was their husband, says the Lord. But this is the covenant that I will make with the house of Israel after those days, says the Lord: I will put my law within them, and I will write it on their hearts; and I will be their God, and they shall be my people. No longer shall they teach one another, or say to each other, "Know the Lord," for they shall all know me, from the least of them to the greatest, says the Lord; for I will forgive their iniquity, and remember their sin no more.

Second Reading, a reading from Hebrews.


(*Hebrews 5:5-10*)




# **GATHERING OF GIFTS**

# **EUCHARISTIC PRAYER**




